

SRI LANKA TO RESUME CHARTER FLIGHTS

From 26th December 2020

The much awaited news of the vaccine being approved in the UK and in the US has drawn a renewed sense of hope for the tourism industry in Sri Lanka. The Civil Aviation Authority of Sri Lanka (CAASL) has confirmed opening up of Sri Lanka's airspace for commercial and charter flight operations to Sri Lanka. After a period of 8 months since March 2020, Sri Lanka is expected to welcome its first charter flight on the 26th of December to the Mattala International Airport located in the south of the Island which will be beneficial for the hotels and resorts in the south and south-east coasts. This is the first phase to be operated as a travel bubble.

In light of this positive news, the Colombo Airport is expected to open for commercial flight operations during the 2nd or 3rd week of January 2021. The resumption of flights will have to go through strict regulations and safety protocols with a mandatory stay of 7 days in any of the level-1 safe hotels certified by the tourism ministry. We expect the restrictions to ease off momentarily by end of January to early February for touring to begin.

Currently, Sri Lanka tourism & the Health Authorities are meeting regularly to discuss the way forward. We are quite upbeat about the opening of the airport and resumption of tourism & we shall keep you informed of the developments.

REMARKABLE STORIES FROM "SRI LANKAN TRAIL TROOPS" ON ROADS LESS TRAVELLED



SRI LANKA TO BAN SINGLE-USE PLASTIC IN 2021

Sri Lankan Parliament, on 19th October approved the proposal to ban a range of single use plastic products in local markets effective from 01st January 2021.

This includes the items of Chemicals or pesticides packaged in Poly Ethylene Terephthalate (PET) and Vinyl Chloride (PVC) containers, sachets made of polythene and plastic less than 20 ml / 20 g (excluding food and medicine), various inflatable toys made of plastic and plastic cotton buds.

Proactive measures were also taken by the authorities when a few alternatives were proposed to use instead of the above items.

How do we, as a travel agency in Sri Lanka support this action?

Since the inception of Authenticities, we have been responsible for using over 160,000 single-use plastic bottles a year on travels. Despite us not having a solution to this hindrance in a timely manner, in the year 2018 we took the initiation to discontinue all single-use plastic water bottles and replace them with reusable 20L water dispensers where we use a pump to refill the insulated stainless-steel water bottles for our travellers.

Supporting the same initiatives and principles, we're thankful and glad that the local government is soon to act on this as permanent conduct.
